


## What is special about Enviroschools?

Enviroschools is a **national network of change makers** empowering children and young people


Enviroschools takes a **holistic approach** to the development of connected resilient and sustainable communities

Enviroschools addresses the root causes of issues, not just the symptoms










## Why Invest in Enviroschools?
